No two TMS products are alike. In fact, with vendors offering an array of add-ons and other custom features, most individual deployments are unique. Still, **at the heart of all TMS products is a software engine that strives to create maximum transportation efficiency for its users.** “TMS vendors use mathematical algorithms to calculate the lowest cost to move goods where they need to be, on time, using the available transportation modes,” says Greg Aimi, TMS analyst, AMR Research.

Most TMS vendors offer products designed to assist manufacturers, retailers, and other companies that need to move products from one place to another. Given the large number of potential customers, and the sizeable amount of money in play, it's not surprising that the TMS market has spawned a fierce pack of vendors – including enterprise resource planning (ERP) giants SAP and Oracle – each trying to differentiate itself from the competition. Targeting a specific customer base, offering both hosted and licensed versions of products, and integrating TMS functions into ERP-based solutions are just some techniques vendors are using to find a market niche.

Explanation of Software Types:

LICENSED: The TMS vendor allows an individual or company to use its software. Licensed software usually resides on company-owned-and-operated servers.

HOSTED “ON-DEMAND” SOFTWARE: Unlike conventional licensed software, on-demand programs are housed on computers maintained by the software vendor or a third-party provider.

ERP-BASED: Software that offers an integrated solution spanning financials, sourcing, demand planning and transportation.
